The PHC launched Keep Clean, Singapore! (KCS) campaign annually to raise awareness on the problem of littering and to nudge fellow Singapore residents to take collective responsibility to uphold higher standards of hygiene and cleanliness in their everyday lives. The PHC also work closely with 3P partners (People, Public and Private organisations) on the adoption of socially responsible behaviours to raise the standards of public hygiene and safeguard public health while there are regulations in place.


During the quarterly SG Clean Day on Sunday, 30 July 2023, Sport Singapore joined PHC as a new partner, with all ActiveSG centres in Singapore ceasing to sweep public areas from 6am to 12midnight. They also showed appreciation to their cleaners on this day for their efforts in maintaining cleanliness in Singapore.

On the same day, Mr. Lim Biow Chuan, Grassroots Advisor for Mountbatten and Coordinating Chairman for PAP Town Councils, and Mr. Andrew Khng, PHC Chairman, along with the residents of Dakota Breeze, launched the 19th CleanPod in Singapore. This initiative allows residents to access shared tools for their clean-ups in their residential estates, particularly on each quarterly SG Clean Day.

Additionally, Ms. Samantha Tian, PHC's Youth Action Group (YAG) Chairperson, led a community Plogathon involving over 100 youths and residents who walked and jogged around the Dakota Breeze Residents' Network estate while picking up litter. Participants were encouraged to download the Stridy app to log their clean-ups on SG Clean Day and make their Clean It Forward pledge. Over 200kg of litter were collected by the youths and residents as they pledged to #CleanItForward for a better SG.

# Together for the Ocean

## #EUBeachCleanUp 2023



#EUBeachCleanUp 2023 led by the European Union Delegation to Singapore

On Saturday, 16 September 2023 at Tiny Beach, Singapore, Ms Iwona Piórko, European Union Ambassador to Singapore kick-started the #EUBeachCleanUp 2023 together with fellow Ambassadors from the diplomatic community and volunteers and environment champions from Singapore and Europe.

On that morning, over 60 participants from Europe and Singapore joined forces to do a massive cleanup at #EUBeachCleanUp 2023 in Singapore. The event was organised by the European Union (EU) Delegation to Singapore, in partnership with Seven Clean Seas.

Cleaning Tiny Beach in the East Coast, participants collected more than 100 large bags – a whole construction skip full – of marine litter. This included ropes, oil canisters, Styrofoam, dozens of flip flops, hundreds of cups and plastic bottles. In attendance: Ambassadors from Europe and beyond, representatives of Singapore’s Public Hygiene Council, families, local entrepreneurs and other nature lovers.

EU Ambassador to Singapore, Ms Iwona Piórko said: “Our oceans are where life started. They generate over half the oxygen we breathe. They feed us and help regulate our climate. Yet, our oceans are under threat. Without action, marine waste will outweigh all the fish in our seas by 2050. Each year, ten million metric tonnes of plastics end up in the ocean. And it is only becoming worse. By 2040, it could be as much as 37 million tonnes per year. I am inspired to see the EU Beach Cleanup in Singapore turn into a blue wave of change, thanks to the support of such a diverse crowd - this morning and over the past few years. Our collective efforts demonstrate how every action counts and why we need all hands-on deck in the fight against marine litter.”

#EUBeachCleanUp 2023 is part of this year's EU Green Diplomacy Weeks, promoting dialogue and cooperation on climate change.

## Secondary school students can submit ideas for repurposing of bulky waste through competition

The PHC has taken the initiative to drive and raise youth awareness and attitudes towards tackling the issue of bulky waste, aiming to better understand its environmental impact and promote individual contributions to waste reduction.

In collaboration with the Ministry of Education (MOE) and J.O.E (Just One Earth) Eco Alliance, the nationwide Bulky Waste to Wonder Competition 2023 was conducted from August to September 2023 with several objectives in mind:

- Addressing the littering problem at its source
- Encouraging everyone to Rethink, Reuse to Reduce
- Preventing the irresponsible disposal of bulky household items, such as used furniture commonly found at housing estates' void decks and bin centres
- Reducing wastage of bulky waste by redesigning and repurposing used bulky waste items
- Unleashing youth's creativity, imagination, and design skills to inspire and promote the message of maintaining cleanliness in Singapore

To prepare students interested in participating in the competition, an in-person workshop was held on Saturday, 26 August 2023. During the workshop, two local furniture designers from JLL Design Solutions and Triple Eyelid shared learnings on transforming post-consumer waste from households, such as unwanted coffee tables, bookshelves, and cabinets, into new functional furniture pieces. The participants also gained knowledge about the impact of color choices on the ergonomics, comfort, user experience, and emotional aspects of using furniture. This workshop provided students with a newfound appreciation for objects, facilitated the exchange of thoughts, and encouraged the sharing of beliefs and attitudes on how they can contribute to reducing bulky waste.

The final event took place in conjunction with the quarterly SG Clean Day on Sunday, 29 October 2023 at the National Gallery Singapore. It featured the collaboration between the top 5 finalists and the design partners who assisted in bringing their ideas to life as functional furniture pieces. These furniture items were auctioned, and the proceeds were donated to the Society of Physically Disabled (SPD).

# Arts & Heritage Venues joins quarterly SG Clean Day (Oct)

On Sunday, 29 October 2023, the PHC extended invitations to Arts and Heritage venues such as Esplanade, Lasalle, NAFA, STPI, and NHB to participate in the quarterly SG Clean Day initiative.

The PHC's RISE Champions Network, comprising 20 volunteers and led by Youth Action Group (YAG) Committee Member, Mr Yasser Amin, conducted a cleanup around Fort Canning Hill Park.

In conjunction with the quarterly SG Clean Day, the finals of the Bulky Waste to Wonder Competition 2023 was held this morning at the National Gallery Singapore. Organised by the PHC, in partnership with the Ministry of Education (MOE) and J.O.E Eco Alliance, this competition aims to unleash creativity and imagination of youths to redesign and repurpose unwanted bulky furniture into functional items. The competition commenced in August 2023, and attracted close to thirty entries from eight secondary schools. To help the participants kickstart their design process, a design workshop was conducted so that the students could learn from industry partners on how to design furniture, the ergonomics, material characteristics and colour psychology.

Participants of five shortlisted entries were subsequently invited to work with industry partners to turn their designs into tangible and functional furniture. A panel of judges then selected the top winners of the competition that morning. These masterpieces was on display at the National Gallery Singapore till Thursday, 2 November 2023, before being roved to other events and locations for exhibition.

Our Guest-of-Honour, Dr Amy Khor, Senior Minister of State for Sustainability and the Environment, presented the prizes to the winners of the competition.

Furthermore, the 5 furniture pieces were auctioned, and proceeds of nearly \$5,000 were donated to Serving People with Disabilities in Singapore (SPD).

# Launch of NEA's Clean Public Toilets Campaign

**21 November 2023** – Senior Parliamentary Secretary for Sustainability and the Environment, Mr Baey Yam Keng, launched the National Environment Agency's (NEA) Clean Public Toilets Campaign (CPT) 2023, together with the Public Hygiene Council (PHC), Restroom Association Singapore (RAS), and Singapore Kindness Movement (SKM).

The PHC, a strong supporter of the campaign since 2021, continued its partnership with NEA to promote wider awareness of good toilet hygiene habits through the PHC's channels and network. Mr Andrew Khng, Chairman of PHC, says, "More people should be aware that public toilet cleanliness is a shared responsibility. Premises operators, users and cleaners must put in collective efforts to do their part and keep it clean. So, let's stop pointing to each other and work towards having clean toilets together." To encourage this partnership, the PHC works with different stakeholders through its Neighbourhood Toilet Community Group (NTCG) initiative to drive the message of joint responsibility in keeping public toilets clean. According to some of the participating coffeeshops such as PDSS 318 Food Cafeteria, MEETUP @ 494 and Get Together Coffeeshop. The toilet cleanliness at their premises have shown significant improvement since joining the programme.

The PHC will also pilot a Toilet Cleanliness module as part of the Buddy Clean Workshop in 2024. It is a programme that aims to inculcate positive social values and norms on cleanliness amongst Primary 3 and 4 students. Through the module, students will get to pick up practical skills and knowledge on how to keep public spaces, including public toilets, clean.



# RISE Learning Journey




The PHC organised an engagement with our RISE Network partners through an evening session conducted on Thursday, 13 July 2023 at Our Tampines Hub (OTH). The session focused on waste reduction and aimed to review the insights gained from the group's visit to the Sembcorp Materials Recovery Facility earlier in the afternoon. During this session, participants toured the food waste eco-digester at OTH, which gathers food waste from all OTH's tenants for conversion into fertilizer. The resulting fertiliser is utilised for in-house planting or distributed to residents.

Participants gained valuable insights into the significance of reducing food waste and its positive impact on the environment. The session commenced with a brief introduction by Mr. Kelvin Thong, Director of Integrated Community Hubs, shedding light on OTH's eco journey over the past few years.

A key takeaway from the session was the importance of proper food waste disposal. The seminar underscored the role that individuals can play in advocating for waste reduction. It emphasized that if businesses and individuals actively contribute to reducing both food and general waste, our environment would significantly improve. By adopting mindful consumption habits, such as ordering only what can be finished when dining out, we can collectively contribute to creating a cleaner and more sustainable world for ourselves and future generations.

## Exploring Marine Litter

Wednesday, 23 August 2023

The impact of litter extends beyond our terrestrial environment, affecting our marine ecosystem as well. To gain insights into the efforts to address marine litter in Singaporean waters, the PHC recently toured Tian San Shipping's operations depot to understand the marine litter issue and witness Tian San's contributions to maintaining clean and clear waterways.

During the visit, it was eye-opening to witness the significant presence of plastic wrappers, bags, and indiscriminate litter in our waterways and seas. Equipped with nets and scoops, the Tian San team diligently works to clear our waters daily, regardless of weather conditions. Utilizing automated collectors and manual nets, they strive to ensure that surface litter is efficiently collected, leaving no room for oversight.

By embracing more sustainable habits and responsibly disposing of our waste, we aim to pave the way for cleaner waterways and a healthier environment for future generations of Singapore residents to thrive in.
